WOLF SANCTUARY TOUR BY FULL MOON

Try to imagine a warm night in late summer, the full "Corn" moon rising, a roaring bonfire and WOLVES howling so close by you can almost touch them! This is what you will experience when you join your SSC friends for the "Full Moon Tour" at the Wolf Sanctuary of Speedwell Forge, on Saturday evening, September 10. Located near Brickerville, just off Rt. 322, this family-run sanctuary is home to approximately 40 rescued wolves. Separated by packs, the wolves roam freely in large fenced areas totaling over 26 acres. A tour guide is stationed at each pack often feeding them and explaining to visitors how each wolf (by NAME) has come to call the sanctuary home. You will have approximately 3 hours, from 7 to 10 pm, to visit the packs and enjoy the bonfire.

Terri Falk will provide hot dogs, buns, condiments and marshmallows – bring your own roasting fork! The cost is \$20 and tickets can be purchased at the sanctuary on September 10. 
