SUN VALLEY, IDAHO January 10–17

Forty SSC members will have the opportunity to travel to the Idaho Rockies and experience a week of skiing and world-class accommodations at the Sun Valley Resort. Sun Valley offers a more relaxed atmosphere not found at some of the other mega ski resort mountains. We will stay at the Sun Valley Inn, a fullservice hotel with restaurants, shops and entertainment on-site. There is a large central lobby which is an ideal gathering space for SSC members. 
TAOS, NEW MEXICO February 21–28



STEAMBOAT, COLORADO March 7–14

This year we are returning to one of SSC's favorite ski resorts, Steamboat Springs, in the prime month of March with 80 SSC members. Steamboat's elevation at the base is only at 6,900'. Steamboat has 6 peaks, with Mt. Werner the highest at 10,568', 165 named trails and lots of tree skiing for the adventurer. Steam-



boat is a mountain for all levels of skiers with 14% beginner, 42% intermediate and 44% advanced runs, the longest over 3 miles long (a nice warm-up leg burner). It also receives an average of 331 inches of snow each year.

We will stay in the Phoenix Luxury Condos at the base of the mountain, just a short distance to the lift (if you're familiar with the Ptarmigan, it's just across the street). We will have mostly 4-bedroom/4-bath units with kitchen, living room area, patio/balcony, a DVD/VCR player, cable TV and a fireplace. The Phoenix has an exercise facility, private laundry facility, internet access, sauna, hot tub and outdoor heated pool. We are planning a welcome party, mountain picnic and a margarita party. The Phoenix is as close to ski-in and ski-out as can be. Travel is an easy bus ride to BWI for a flight to Denver and bus to the resort with a food stop to supply your condo.


Now the important part, the money: \$1,516 per person for 8 people in a 4-bedroom unit, \$1,564pp for 6 people in a 3-bedroom and \$1,631pp for 4 people in a 2-bedroom unit. There are very few 2 and 3 bedroom units.
