BRECKENRIDGE, COLORADO

January 27–February 3, 2018 (Saturday to Saturday)

Breckenridge is a town rich with mining history and welcoming charm and is the host for the 2018 Eastern Pennsylvania Ski Council trip. Clubs throughout the Northeast will join us for a great time at the winter carnival. Several activities are being planned throughout the week; details to follow. Travel with us to experience 187 trails across 2,908 acres that span across five peaks of varied terrain. The resort has a base elevation of 9,600 feet

2,908 acres that span across five peaks of varied terrain. The resort has a base elevation of 9,600 feet and a top elevation of 12,998, the highest lift-accessed terrain in North America. Breckenridge provides a great, walkable town with numerous restaurant and shopping options a short 5-minute walk from the hotel. We will stay at **The DoubleTree Hotel** located across the street from the QuickSilver SuperChair. Our package includes roundtrip airfare from Harrisburg to Denver, bus transportation from Denver to the resort, a kick-off breakfast on Sunday, and a 5-day ticket (also accepted at Arapahoe Basin, Keystone, Vail, and Beaver Creek). SNOWBIRD, UTAH

February 10–17, 2018 (Saturday to Saturday)

Snowbird, Utah is in the heart of the Wasatch-Cache National Forest in Little Cottonwood Canyon, one mile down-canyon from Alta. It has one Aerial Tram, 10 chairlifts including six high-speed detachable quads and four doubles (most with arm and leg rests) and two conveyor lifts. Its uphill capacity is 17,400 skiers and snowboarders per hour with 169 runs. Its longest run is approximately 2.5 miles long and its longest descent is 3.5 miles. Snowbird averages approximately 500 inches of low-density, "dry" Utah powder annually. Thanks to ideal geography and a phenomenon called Lake Effect, Little Cottonwood Canyon powder is known worldwide. This trip includes roundtrip airfare from Harrisburg to Salt Lake City, Utah. A Snowbird-only lift ticket is included for six days for the price of a 5-day lift ticket. There is also an available daily upgrade to ski at Alta. TAOS, NEW MEXICO March 3–10, 2018 (Saturday to Saturday)

Taos Ski Valley is a small and remote ski area compared to other major ski areas SSC is accustomed to visit, and is a powder lover's paradise known for having light dry power and undetectable lift lines. Taos Ski Valley, located in the rugged Sangre de

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Cristo Mountains, is renowned for its expert terrain but also includes a tremendous number of **beginner** and intermediate runs. Off the ski slopes, enjoy tubing on Strawberry Hill; take a guided full moon snowshoe hike; race up a snowmobile trail; or kick back in a hot tub. Taos enjoys sunshine more than 285 days a year. Average Annual Snowfall in the Town of Taos is 35 inches and in Taos Ski Valley is 321 inches. Elevation in the Town of Taos is 6,967 feet and at the base of Taos Ski Valley it is 9,207 feet. This trip includes roundtrip airfare from BWI to Albuquerque, bus transportation to and from airports; a 5 of 6-day lift ticket, group porterage, welcome reception and the general manager will host a group welcome dinner. Experience ski-in/ski-out lodging at the **Snakedance Condos and Spa**. There is an on-site spa, fitness facility and guest lounge. Condos are two bedrooms/two baths, full kitchen and each suite is individually owned and decorated with full amenities. DANUBE WALTZ RIVER CRUISE June 12–20, 2018 (Tuesday to Wednesday)

Join SSC as we travel down the Danube River aboard the Viking Cruise Line's Longship *Vilhjalm*. Your basic cruise will have you flying out on June 12 and arriving in Budapest, Hungary June 13 where you'll transfer to boat and cruise over the next 8 days to Passau. Ports visited along the way include Budapest, Bratislava, Vienna, Krems, Linz, and Passau. Also included are six guided tours with audio headsets (a detailed listing of the guided tours will be emailed under separate cover to interested parties), all port charges, and free wifi. We will visit 4 UNESCO World Heritage sites. The following are also included: 7 breakfasts, 5 lunches, 7 dinners, featuring regional specialties as well as complimentary wine, beer and soft drinks with onboard dinner and lunch service. Included is a Welcome Cocktail Reception & Dinner and a Captain's Farewell Dinner and much more.

Build your own trip on this excursion by choosing from three types of cabins on the Longship *Vihjalm*; you can also choose the airport from which you depart (Dulles or Harrisburg, although Dulles is recommended) and pricing will depend on application date. Transportation to and from Dulles is not included in the cost. This will depend on the number flying out of Dulles and arrangements will be made accordingly.

Reserved Cabins for our trip on the Longship Vihjalm are Category E Standard cabin on the lower deck. Category E and F have rectangular shaped windows at eye level within the room and above the ship's waterline. Category D - a French Balcony stateroom on the middle deck. The French Balcony rooms have a floor to ceiling window with a portion that slides open. There is no outdoor sitting area outside the room. Category B - a Veranda Balcony stateroom on the middle deck. These rooms have a small outside sitting area with two chairs and a sliding glass door on the outside wall of the room. There are other cabins on the upper deck and may be available. If interested, please let your trip leader know to obtain pricing of such.



You can extend your overseas stay by adding a two-day optional pre-trip 2-night extension in Budapest and/or a post trip 3-night extension in Prague. If you take the optional pre trip you will fly out on June 10, arriving Budapest on the 11th. Stay in Budapest 2 nights and board the cruise ship on June 13. If extending your trip to Prague, on June 20 you will be transported to Prague for 3 nights lodging and fly home from Prague on June 23.

Mark your calendars and be ready to reserve your spot. Trip price will be publicized and trip sales will open just around the corner–stay tuned for an announcement via SSC email blast. HAVE YOU RENEWED YOUR MEMBERSHIP?

SSC's new membership year began on April 1, and we urge you to renew your membership today so you don't miss any of our great events, or a chance to sign up for upcoming trips. You have choice in how to renew your SSC membership:

- You can personally hand in a completed membership application form (see below) and your check for a year's membership dues at an upcoming club event, or you can mail your form and dues to the club's PO box. Members who choose this option can expect to receive confirmation of current membership in approximately two-three weeks.
- 2. You can renew your membership online. Members who choose this option can be sure that SSC has correct contact information for them (it can be challenging to decipher handwritten applications) and will receive immediate confirmation of current membership when dues are paid online. To facilitate the online renewal process, each SSC membership not previously renewed received a reminder email from the club on April 1. This email included directions for logging on to our website's membership app where you can complete the renewal process. If you have forgotten your password, a link is provided in this email for obtaining a new temporary password. If any of your contact information (i.e., email address, mailing address, telephone number) has changed, this is the time to update our records. Click on the "Edit Profile" button at the top of your profile page to make changes. When you're ready to complete the process, click on the "Renew until April 1, 2018" button. This will initiate a membership dues payment loop, where you have the option of paying your dues by mailing in a check, by paying with your PayPal account, or by paying your dues with a debit or credit card.
